Located in the rural Appalachian Mountains of Kentucky, Millard School is a K-8 facility with a total enrollment of 565. Beginning with the 2017-2018 school year, Millard School was combined into one campus from two separately located campus' (3 Headstart Classroom and K-2 classrooms at one campus and 3-8 classrooms at a second campus). We are now a combined single campus. Our teaching staff is classified as 100% highly qualified and assigned within their areas of certification.

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Our middle school STLP showcase advanced to the state level competition. Several students competed in both All-County and All-District Bands. 5 middle student groups won first place in their divisions at the Regional Entrepreneur Fair. A middle school student won the Pike County Spelling Bee Champion. Extracurricular Activities: Band, Academic Teams (Elementary and Middle), football, basketball (Boys & Girls Jr. High Teams and Little League), Girls Volleyball, 4-H, Unite Club, STLP, Cheerleading, Gold/Silver/Bronze Club, Monthly Attendance/Citizenship Awards, Too Good For Drugs, and Accelerated Reader Honors, Student Academic placement in district, regional, and state levels. Data derived from the KPREP and MAP test results, as well as both formal and informal classroom observations by the administration, were reviewed to determine the needs of the school. Focus was given to vertical/ horizontal alignment of curriculum, data analysis, formal assessments and evaluations. Focus areas include: Data Driven PLC's: growth, data tracking, data wise questioning, , Schoolwide RTI intervention, and progress monitoring.
